APPENDIX 1: GLOSSARY

Archaeological site - A place with evidence of past human activity. This evidence may include Aboriginal and/or historic artefacts, features, structures or organic traces.

Artefact scatter - A surface scatter of Aboriginal or historic cultural material. Scatters of stone artefacts are a common archaeological site type. These scatters may also contain charcoal, discarded animal bones, shell and ochre.

Assemblage - A collection of artefacts from a single archaeological site.

Burial site - A place with a concentration of human remains. Ochre, stone tools, charcoal and grave goods may be associated with burials. Most burial sites are found in sand dunes but dead trees, caves and rockshelters were also used.

Ceremonial ground - Place that may be associated with initiation ceremonies, meetings or sacred rituals. Stone arrangements may be present, including cairns, stone circles or standing slabs of rock.

Chert - A fine-grained opaline rock ranging in color from white to black, but most often grey, brown, grayish brown and light green to rusty red.

Core - A piece of stone from which flakes have been removed. They usually have negative flake scares that have resulted from the removal of flakes.

Cultural material - Any material remains or objects resulting from human activity.

Debitage - Any waste material including flakes and cores produced during the manufacture of chipped stone tools.

Flake - A piece of stone detached from a core that typically displays a striking platform, bulb of percussion and flake scars on the ventral surface.

Flaked piece - Small fragments of stone resulting from the manufacture of stone tools. A striking platform or bulb of percussion may not be evident.

Formalized tools - An artefact that has been deliberately shaped by flaking, retouch or grinding to produce a predetermined tool type.

Ground surface visibility - The amount of bare ground exposed, usually expressed as a percentage.

Hearth - The remains of a campfire containing charcoal, discoloured soil, and possibly, hearthstones, heat retainers or the remains of animals or shellfish cooked and consumed at the campsite.

Hearthstone – Stone cobble placed in a campfire to retain heat for cooking. The types of stone used as hearthstones in western Victoria includes calcrete and sandstone.

Heat retainer - Nodule of baked clay, thought to have been placed in campfires to retain heat for cooking.

in situ - An artefact or other feature that has not been disturbed from its original position.

Mound - Raised areas of earth ranging from 3 to 35 m in diameter and from 0.5 m to 2 m in height. Earth oven material, stone artefacts, food refuse and the remains of hut foundations have been recovered from excavated earth mounds in the central and western parts of Victoria.

Ochre - Soft varieties of the iron oxides goethite, limonite or haematite usually coloured red or yellow and used as pigment for painting.

Quarry - An outcrop of stone or ochre where Aboriginal people have extracted the raw material for use or trade. Stone quarries are identifiable by a dense scatter of broken stone and flakes or consist of pits or hollows where material has been dug out of the ground.

Quartz – A silica mineral resistant to weathering because of its hardness. It is commonplace in the landscape as a consequence.



Quartzite - A metamorphic rock formed by the re-crystallization of quartz.

Retouch - A stone artefact with fine, secondary flaking along one or more edges.

Scarred tree - A tree with a scar on its trunk caused by bark removal.

Shell midden - A surface scatter or heap of discarded shell often with charcoal, animal bones and stone artefacts. Middens may found near coastlines, rivers, creeks, swamps and ancient lakes.

Silcrete - A hard, fine-grained rock composed of silica cement.

Stone feature - Cairns, rock wells, grinding groves, stone structures, fish traps and stone arrangements are examples of stone features.

Stratified deposit - Material that has been laid down over time forming a sequence of events.

Subsurface testing - A method of excavation used for detecting cultural material below the ground surface. Testing is commonly by shovel, trowel or hand auger.

Survey - An inspection of land either by foot or vehicle for the purpose of identifying archaeological sites.

Transect - A predetermined area or a path that directs the course of a survey.

1 INTRODUCTION

Whitehaven Coal Limited (WHC) proposes to develop the Vickery Coal Project, located approximately 15 kilometres (km) south-east of Boggabri in New South Wales (NSW) (Figure 1).

The NSW Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) (previously the Department of Environment, Climate Change and Water [DECCW]) (2010a) defines Aboriginal cultural heritage as consisting of places and items that are of significance to Aboriginal people because of their traditions, observances, lore, customs, beliefs and history. Activities that impact the landscape may affect Aboriginal cultural heritage.

This document presents a Proposed Methodology for the Aboriginal cultural and archaeological assessment of the Vickery Coal Project (the Project). The proposed Project would involve the development of an open-cut coal mining operation, related surface facilities and a new private haul road and overpass across the Kamilaroi Highway.

This Proposed Methodology has been designed to conform to the relevant requirements of various advisory documents and guidelines. These guidelines and documents include:

- Guide to Investigating, Assessing and Reporting on Aboriginal Cultural Heritage in New South Wales (OEH, 2011a).
- Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Consultation Requirements for Proponents 2010 (Part 6 National Parks and Wildlife Act, 1974) (DECCW, 2010a).
- Code of Practice for Archaeological Investigation of Aboriginal Objects in New South Wales (DECCW, 2010b).
- Clause 80C of the NSW National Parks and Wildlife Regulation, 2009.
- Draft Guidelines for Aboriginal Cultural Impact Assessment and Community Consultation (NSW Department of Environment and Conservation [DEC], 2005).
- The Burra Charter: The Australia ICOMOS Charter for Places of Cultural Significance (Australia International Council on Monuments and Sites [ICOMOS], 1999).
- Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Standards and Guidelines Kit (NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service, 1997).



2 PROJECT SUMMARY

The main activities associated with the development of the Project would include:

- Recommencement of open cut mining activities at the Vickery Coal Mine.
- Production of run-of-mine (ROM) coal at a rate up to 4.5 million tonnes per annum (Mtpa) for a 30 year mine life.
- Development of two out-of-pit waste rock emplacements.
- Development of an infrastructure area and associated ROM coal handling infrastructure.
- Diversion of a section of Blue Vale Road and Shannon Harbour Road.
- Transport of ROM coal from the pit top to the Whitehaven coal handling and processing plant (CHPP) located in Gunnedah via trucks on public and private roads.
- Construction of a new private haul road between Blue Vale Road and the Whitehaven CHPP in Gunnedah including an overpass over the Kamilaroi Highway.
- Development of a raw water supply system.
- Development of an on-site water management system, including water diversions and storages.
- Ongoing exploration and monitoring activities.


All of the activities described above that require surface disturbance would be undertaken within the study areas shown on Figure 1. The study area for the proposed coal extraction, waste rock emplacement, infrastructure area and associated facilities/activities is shown in more detail on Figure 2. It is not known at this early stage in the Project the exact location of all Project components. However, they would all be located within the study areas shown on Figures 1 and 2 and the field surveys and investigations to be undertaken as part of the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment will cover the study areas.

3 OBJECTIVE OF COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

The objective of community consultation is for Aboriginal people to have the opportunity to improve assessment outcomes by:

- providing relevant information about the cultural significance and values of the Aboriginal object(s) and/or place(s);
- influencing the design of the method to assess cultural and scientific significance of Aboriginal object(s) and/or place(s);
- actively contributing to the development of cultural heritage management options and recommendations for any Aboriginal object(s) and/or place(s) within the study area; and
- commenting on the draft assessment report before it is submitted to government.

4 PREVIOUS ARCHEAOLOGICAL INVESTIGATIONS

A number of Aboriginal heritage assessments have been undertaken in the area surrounding the Project. These include:

- The Report of the Investigation for Archaeological Relics and Sites at the Site of a Proposed Open Cut Coal Mine, 'Whitehaven', North of Gunnedah, Northern NSW (Appleton, 1999).
- The Archaeological Investigation for Sites of Indigenous Cultural Heritage on the Site of the Proposed Canyon Extension (John Appleton Archaeological Surveys & Reports, 2004).
- Aboriginal Heritage Assessment of the Belmont Coal Project (Archaeological Surveys and Reports Pty Ltd, 2007).

A search of the OEH Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System (AHIMS) register was undertaken on 5 October 2011 for a 100 square kilometre (km²) grid centered on the study area for the proposed Vickery Coal Mine (Figure 2). Based on the results of the previous investigations and the October 2011 AHIMS search, a total of six Aboriginal heritage sites have been identified within the study area for the proposed Vickery Coal Mine (Table 1 and Figure 2).

A copy of the site cards for the Aboriginal heritage sites identified within the study area are provided in Attachment 1.

5 CONSULTATION TO DATE

A summary of the consultation undertaken to date in accordance with the Section 4.1 of the *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Consultation Requirements for Proponents 2010* (DECCW, 2010a) for the Vickery Coal Project is outlined below.

The following organisations were asked for names of Aboriginal persons or groups who may hold cultural knowledge of, or have a right or interest in Aboriginal objects, places and/or Aboriginal cultural heritage values in the study area or surrounds:

- OEH Dubbo Environmental Protection and Regulation Group;
- Red Chief Local Aboriginal Land Council;
- The Registrar, Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983;
- The National Native Title Tribunal:
- Native Title Services Corporation Limited (NTSCORP Limited);
- Gunnedah Shire Council;
- Narrabri Shire Council; and
- Namoi Catchment Management Authority.

WHC provided written notification of the proposed Project to Aboriginal stakeholders identified by the organisations listed above, as well as those stakeholders previously consulted with for the nearby Tarrawonga Coal Mine. These stakeholders were invited to register an interest in the process of community consultation with WHC regarding the Aboriginal cultural heritage assessment of the proposed Project.

In addition to the written notifications, a notice was placed in the Namoi Valley Independent (29 September 2011) seeking registrations from any additional interested Aboriginal stakeholders.

6 CULTURAL ASSESSMENT METHODOLOGY

The objectives of the consultation process are described in Section 3.

In accordance with the *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Consultation Requirements for Proponents 2010* (DECCW, 2010a), WHC requests that registered Aboriginal stakeholders provide, where relevant, during the conduct of the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment, cultural information regarding:

- whether there are any Aboriginal objects of cultural value to Aboriginal people in the study area or surrounds; and
- whether there are any places of cultural value to Aboriginal people in the study area or surrounds.

This may include places of social, spiritual and cultural value, historic places with cultural significance, and potential places/areas of historic, social, spiritual and/or cultural significance.

The cultural assessment and consultation process will involve the following:

- distribution of this proposed assessment methodology to registered Aboriginal stakeholders;
- review of the proposed assessment methodology by registered Aboriginal stakeholders who may
 wish to advise any matters such as issues/areas of cultural significance that might affect, inform
 or refine the assessment methodology;
- consultation with registered Aboriginal stakeholders regarding the cultural context and value of Aboriginal objects and/or places that may be in the study area or surrounds (including appropriate management of any cultural information provided by registered Aboriginal stakeholders that is sensitive or has restricted public access);
- assessment of the significance of Aboriginal objects and/or places located in the study area or surrounds based on the context, Aboriginal heritage values and archaeological assessment;
- consultation with registered Aboriginal stakeholders regarding potential management options to avoid or mitigate harm and/or conserve known Aboriginal objects and/or places; and
- documentation of feedback received as part of the cultural assessment from registered Aboriginal stakeholders for presentation in the final cultural heritage assessment report (subject to the sensitivity of the information provided).

Sensitive Cultural Information - Management Protocol

In the event that a registered Aboriginal party has sensitive or restricted public access information it is proposed that WHC would manage this information (if provided by the Aboriginal community) in accordance with a sensitive cultural information management protocol. It is anticipated that the protocol will include making note of and managing the material in accordance with the following key limitations/requirements as advised by Aboriginal people at the time of the information being provided:

- any restrictions on access to the material;
- any restrictions on communication of the material;
- any restrictions on the location/storage of the material;
- any cultural recommendations on handling the material;
- any contextual information;
- any names and contact details of persons authorised within the relevant Aboriginal group to make decisions concerning the Aboriginal material and the degree of authorisation;
- any details of any consent given in accordance with customary law;
- the level of confidentiality to be accorded to the material; and
- any access and use by the registered Aboriginal parties of the cultural information in the material.

7 ARCHAEOLOGICAL ASSESSMENT METHODOLOGY

The archaeological assessment will involve the following:

- a search of the OEH AHIMS database;
- a search of the National Heritage List, Commonwealth Heritage List and register of the National Estate:
- provision of existing information on Aboriginal heritage within the study area and surrounds to the registered Aboriginal stakeholders, including copies of site cards for sites within the proposed Vickery Coal Mine study area (Attachment 1);
- literature review of relevant cultural heritage and archaeological reports and publications;
- site inspection/survey of known sites within the study area with the assistance of registered Aboriginal stakeholders;
- archaeological significance assessment based on existing information and additional information collected during the site inspections/survey and consultation with Aboriginal stakeholders; and
- preparation of an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment report.

Information from previous archaeological investigations in the vicinity of the proposed Project will inform the site inspection/survey of the study area and will also be incorporated into the archaeological significance assessment.

8 ABORIGINAL CULTURAL HERITAGE ASSESSMENT REPORT

Following consultation on the methodology of the cultural heritage assessment and the undertaking of any required field components, a draft Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment report will be prepared. The draft Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment report will be provided to registered Aboriginal stakeholders for review and feedback and will include:

- details of the objects and places identified within the study area and an assessment of potential impacts from the Project;
- records of the Aboriginal stakeholder consultation conducted and how any comments received throughout the assessment process were considered; and
- proposed management and mitigation recommendations drawing on information provided by registered Aboriginal stakeholders and the findings of the cultural and archaeological assessments.

9 KEY ABORIGINAL COMMUNITY INPUT POINTS IN THE ASSESSMENT PROCESS

Key input points in the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment impact assessment process for feedback from the Aboriginal community regarding research methodology, cultural significance and management of potential impacts on heritage sites/values may include:

- written or verbal feedback prior to or during the Project information session;
- written or verbal feedback on the Proposed Methodology;
- verbal feedback and comments during site inspection/survey of the study area;
- written or verbal feedback following the site inspection/survey and prior to the issue of the draft Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment to the registered Aboriginal parties for review; and
- verbal or written feedback on the draft Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment.

In addition to the above, written or verbal feedback can be provided at any stage throughout the consultation process (i.e. until the completion of the draft Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment review period).

In the event that a registered Aboriginal party has sensitive or restricted public access information it is proposed that WHC will manage this information in accordance with a sensitive cultural information management protocol outlined in Section 6.

10 CRITICAL TIMELINES

As discussed above, provision of comments on the Proposed Methodology to WHC is required by 14 November 2011.

Critical timelines for the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment of the Vickery Coal Project are outlined below. Please note that these timelines are estimates at this early stage in the process and are provided to allow forward planning of personnel and resources. WHC will provide subsequent notification and clarification (i.e. actual dates and approach for field work participation) of the below timelines once greater certainty is available.

- 1. Information session for Aboriginal stakeholders: 31 October 2011.
- 2. Provision of comments on Proposed Methodology: 14 November 2011.
- 3. Collation of cultural significance information: Ongoing throughout process until end of draft Aboriginal Cultural Heritage report review period.
- 4. Site inspection/survey: November 2011.
- 5. Provision of a draft Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment report (including proposed management and mitigation measures) to registered Aboriginal stakeholders for review: January 2012 (following field survey).
- 6. Provision of comments on draft Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment report: January/February 2012.
- 7. Finalisation of the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment report in consideration of comments received: March 2012.



Searching the NNTT Registers in New South Wales

Search service

On request the National Native Title Tribunal will search its public registers for you. A search may assist you in finding out whether any native title applications (claims), determinations or agreements exist over a particular area of land or water.

In New South Wales native title cannot exist on privately owned land including family homes or farms.

What information can a search provide?

A search can confirm whether any applications, agreements or determinations are registered in a local government area. Relevant information, including register extracts and application summaries, will be provided.

In NSW because we cannot search the registers in relation to individual parcels of land we search by local government area.

Most native title applications do not identify each parcel of land claimed. They have an external boundary and then identify the areas not claimed within the boundary by reference to types of land tenure e.g., freehold, agricultural leasehold, public

What if the search shows no current applications?

If there is no application covering the local government area this only indicates that at the time of the search either the Federal Court had not received any claims in relation to the local government area or the Tribunal had not yet been notified of any new native title claims.

It does not mean that native title does not exist in the area.

Native title may exist over an area of land or waters whether or not a claim for native title has been made.

Where the information is found

The information you are seeking is held in three registers and on an applications database.

National Native Title Register

The National Native Title Register contains determinations of native title by the High Court, Federal Court and other courts.

Register of Native Title Claims

The Register of Native Title Claims contains applications for native title that have passed a registration test.

Registered claims attract rights, including the right to negotiate about some types of proposed developments.

Register of Indigenous Land Use Agreements

The Register of Indigenous Land Use Agreements contains agreements made with people who hold or assert native title in an area.

The register identifies development activities that have been agreed by the parties.

Application summaries

An application summary contains a description of the location, content and status of a native title claim.

This information may be different to the information on the Register of Native Title Claims, e.g., because an amendment has not yet been tested.





Dear Dany

In response to your letter requesting feedback for the proposed methodology which I have read and put together a list of ideas for you to consider.

I would like also to add that you may consider giving all stake holders an opportunity to have two people inducted per stake holder, this would eliminate

the risk of losing work if someone couldn't make it due to unforseen circumstances or if more than one person was required for the work.

I would like you to consider that any current stakeholders who take part in the methodology process should be the only people to take part in work, in the study area.

For surface collection:

- Artefacts will be flagged and the site photographed
- · artefacts to be bagged and tagged

Test excavation

- a checkerboard pattern of test excavation across the nominated area
- 1metre square and mechanically excavated as 5cm spits

Manual excavation should occur if the following is encountered:

- A density of artefacts greater than 10 artefacts/spit/ 1 metre square
- hammerstones, axes, grind stones, cores, or a possible knapping event are identified.

Manual excavation should cease if

- artefacts drop below 5/spit/1mtr square
- artefacts are no longer located
- the edge of the disturbance foot print is reached
- test excavation should cease when clay or bedrock is encountered

Care and control

Artefacts should be recovered during subsurface testing and salvage within the project area and should be
held in a container on site until all archaeological and culture salvage is complete in the area, a secure
location should be selected to undertake the artefacts recording and analysis, any artefacts identified as
having high cultural value should be retained for teaching purposes and kept at a selected place (to be
determined by the stake holders) for safe keeping, the remainder should be returned to country for burial as
close as possible to their finding location.

An OEH site card with the burial location to be provided with OEH.

All artefacts to be packaged according to Australian Museum standards.

Cultural values and significance

• The project area is a part of some of the Registered Aboriginal parties traditional home lands (country) and as such retains immeasurable cultural values.

Aboriginal cultural heritage provides crucial links between the past and present and therefore represents an essential part of the identities of Aboriginal people and all Australians.

Access

Aboriginal people should have access to areas of cultural significance, providing access can be provided without compromise to safety, these arrangement should be discussed with steak holders and Whitehaven Coal.

 - request for participants to provide WHC with relevant cultural information;
 - management protocols for cultural information;
 - archaeological assessment methodology;
 - known Aboriginal Sites within the Study Area; and
 - content of the ACHA report.
- Request for feedback on the proposed methodology (reiteration of the deadline for feedback on the proposed methodology is 16 November 2011 and that comments can be provided in writing or verbally).
- Overview of the next steps for the ACHA including finalisation of the draft methodology and the proposed survey/inspection of the study area.

The following questions and comments were raised during the presentation of the above subjects.

- Q. Stephen Talbott: Inquired about previous archaeological surveys that had been undertaken in the area and the status of the Aboriginal heritage sites that had been located during these surveys.
- **A.** Danny Young: Responded that the surveys were undertaken in the 1980's and several different companies have owned the mine since the surveys were undertaken. An investigation into the status of known Aboriginal heritage sites within the Project area would be undertaken as part of the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment.
- Q. Mitchum Neave: Inquired about the approval process for the Project.
- **A.** Clive Berry: Approval for the Project is being sought under Part 4 of the NSW Environmental Planning and Assessment Act, 1979.
- **C.** Stephen Talbott: Commented that traditional owners should speak for the country not OEH or the land councils.
- **Q.** *Mitchum Neave:* Commented that WHC should give early notification of upcoming meetings, fieldwork etc to avoid clashes with other projects in the area.
- **A.** Danny Young: Responded that if WHC was made aware by the community of clashes with other projects that they would endeavour to work around these.
- **Q.** Mitchum Neave and Veronica Talbott: Commented that the elders in the community should be involved in the consultation process as their knowledge was important in determining the cultural significance of the area.
- **A.** Danny Young: Responded that if WHC was made aware of the elders in the community that they would involve them in the consultation process for the Project.
- Q. Cindy Foley: Inquired about the status of the axe grinding grooves near the Project area.
- **A.** Danny Young: Responded that the axe grinding grooves were located during in the 1980's and was unsure of their current status. The grinding grooves were located outside the disturbance area and would not be directly impacted by the Project. They would be reinspected as part of the surveys for the Project.
- **Q.** Cindy Foley: Commented that the grinding grooves would be impacted by blast vibrations and dust from the Project.

- **A.** Danny Young: Responded that an impact assessment would be included in the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment report and would look at direct and indirect impacts on Aboriginal heritage sites in and around the Project area.
- Q. Cindy Foley: Inquired about the status of the two sites near the Canyon Coal Mine.
- **A.** Danny Young: Responded that the scar tree was avoided during the construction/operation of the Canyon Coal Mine and he was uncertain to the current status of the isolated artefact. An investigation into the status of known Aboriginal heritage sites within the Project area would be undertaken as part of the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment.
- **C.** Cindy Foley: Commented that areas with low visibility (i.e. long grass) should be cleared prior to surveys.
- C. Michael Long: Commented that the Project area was a hunting ground and an area where he could teach his children to hunt.
- **Q.** Stephen Talbott: Commented that these meetings were a good opportunity to raise the need to employ Aboriginal people in the mining industry.
- **C.** Cindy Foley: Commented that multiple people from multiple groups should be involved in the field surveys so that all information could be shared.
- C. Cindy Foley: The overpass area is an important place to fish and collect firewood.
- Q. Cindy Foley: Inquired about the storage of salvaged artefacts. She commented that the artefacts shouldn't be stored at the land council and a specific storage area should be built so that everyone could access the artefacts.
- **A.** Danny Young: Responded that a storage place for salvaged artefacts would be nominated in consultation with the Aboriginal community.
- **C.** *Donna Sampson:* Commented that meetings should be organised between Aboriginal parties to discuss the findings of the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment.
- **C.** Leonard Talbott: Commented that the people that made the effort to attend this meeting should be the ones consulted with.
- **A.** Danny Young: Responded that it was an open consultation process.
- **C.** Leonard Talbott: Commented that it was up to the Aboriginal community to determine cultural significance of the Project area.

2. Study Area Inspection

Interested registered Aboriginal parties drove around the Project area (including the proposed section of private haul road and overpass over the Kamilaroi Highway) and stopped at several locations so that the proposed Project could be described and discussed.

The end of the inspection concluded the formal discussions.

Danny,

We have read and discussed the above Vicky Coal project Aboriginal Culture Heritage Assessment and have some concerns as follows.

Section 1 of the draft report states that the ACHA was prepared in accordance with the following guidelines:

- > DECCW (2010) consultation requirements
- > DECCW (2010) Code of Practice
- ➢ OEH (2011) ACHA guidelines
- DEC (2005) Part 3A guidelines
- > Australia ICOMOS (1999) Burra Charter
- NPWS (1997) Standards and Guidelines Kit
- > AHC (2002) Ask First
- > NSW Minerals Council (2010) Due Diligence Code of Practice

However, there are several aspects of the ACHA process undertaken and draft report provided that do not reflect the principles and specific requirements of the above guidelines. Key concerns relate to:

- Basic information on the Project is not provided, such as the size (ha) of the Project area, the size (ha) of the disturbance area within the Project area, and mapping which clearly illustrates this (noting that Figure 2 of the draft ACHA does not clearly illustrate this)
 Aboriginal involvement in all stages of the assessment and management process, with consultation specifically lacking in:
 - 1. > The lack of a consultative process to seek Aboriginal registrant views on the cultural values of the Project area
 - The approach that views of some Aboriginal registrants 'are considered to be indicative of Aboriginal community attitudes' (Section 10.2). OEH guidelines acknowledge the diversity of social values that may occur within the Aboriginal community, who may have a range of traditional, historic and contemporary attachments to an area. To assume a singular view of cultural significance amongst the Aboriginal registrants involved in the Project is not appropriate, and it does not reflect professional guidelines
 - The inclusion of an assessment of social significance of archaeological sites that does not reflect past Aboriginal registrant input on social significance
 - The lack of consultation to actively involve Aboriginal people in determining Project impacts to culture heritage values
 - 7. > The lack of consultation to actively involve Aboriginal people in developing management options and determining appropriate final management recommendations
 - The level of ethno historic research presented in the draft ACHA is limited, and it does not reflect the range of past Aboriginal associations with the Project area-including the historical experiences of Aboriginal people in the region.
 - 3. The predictive model developed for the Project does not integrate ethno historic information on past Aboriginal associations with the Project area, both pre- and post-contact
 - 5. > The level of information on the archaeological survey strategy is limited, and it does not provide a justification for sampling, or describe how sampling relates to the Project area/disturbance area, and how each landform proposed for impact will be sampled
 - No information is provided on the coverage of the archaeological survey, being the total area inspected (ha) and the placement of survey transects; which should be describe in writing and illustrated on mapping.
 - 5. No information is provided on the effectiveness of survey coverage, given ground surface visibility conditions at the time of survey



- The draft ACHA does not provide an assessment of the archaeological potential of the landforms of the Project area, considering both the occurrence of surface sites and features beyond survey areas, and the distribution and integrity of subsurface archaeological deposits. The draft ACHA also fails to discuss the archaeological potential of landforms normally identified as being of high archaeological potential, being creek lines, the floodplain of the Namoi River and foot slopes with colluvium.
- The draft ACHA provides a limited discussion of the <u>meaning</u> of the archaeology of the Project area, which OEH describe as discussion of what events took place in the past, how the landscape was used and why the identified Aboriginal objects are in this location.
- 21. > The draft ACHA does not provide an assessment of the historic significance of the Project area and the specific places/objects contained within it
- The draft ACHA presents an assessment of the social significance of known archaeological sites, but does not discuss the social significance of the broader area and non-archaeological places to Aboriginal registrants reflecting a limited consultation process regarding cultural values.
- The draft ACHA presents an assessment of the social significance of known archaeological sites, which describes all sites except one as being of low significance (and describes the remaining site a grinding groove and scatter complex as being of moderate significance). This does not reflect Aboriginal registrant input on the significance of archaeological sites, and this section should be urgently amended to document Aboriginal registrant views, as OEH guidelines identify that it is only Aboriginal people that determine the social significance of Aboriginal cultural heritage.
- The assessment of aesthetic significance makes no comment on the importance of sites and places to Aboriginal people.
- The assessment of Project impact is limited to archaeological sites only, and does not address the broader impact of the Project on the landforms of the Project area, including landforms of archaeological potential.
- The impact assessment includes a statement that the impact of blasting (vibration) to the grinding groove site will be negligible, although no information on how this was determined has been included or discussed with Aboriginal registrants
 - 7. The management strategy for the Project is limited in scope, on the basis that the Project area contains no archaeological sites of high social or scientific value, and that there are no other places or objects of cultural value. This is questioned and considered insufficient, as the ACHA does not adequately assess the cultural values and the archaeological potential of the Project area, and management strategies have not been developed in consultation with Aboriginal registrants. The following management strategies are identified as requiring discussion with Aboriginal registrants for inclusion in the revised ACHA:



- Management protocols for continued Aboriginal registrant involvement and consultation
- > Management protocols for the management (protection) of known archaeological sites not impacted by the Project
- Management protocols for the management of new finds (all archaeological objects as defined by the NPW Act)
- Management protocols for due diligence inspections of additional or relocated Project infrastructure within the Project's disturbance footprint, if not specifically assessed by Protocols for archaeological excavation (test pitting and open area salvage) for sites/landforms of archaeological potential
- Management protocols for erosion and sediment control works in landforms of archaeological potential
- Management protocols for access to cultural sites and areas by Aboriginal community members
- Management protocols for baselines recording of the grinding groove site and blast vibration monitoring if appropriate
- > Management protocols for the temporary care of salvaged objects
- Management protocols for the ongoing review and revision of the Project ACHMP
- Any additional management protocols identified by the completed cultural values assessment and assessment of archaeological potential.
- The draft ACHA does not contain a technical archaeological appendix, which is the approach outlined by both the OEH Code of Practice for Archaeological Investigations (DECCW 2010) and the OEH (2011) ACHA guideline. Even if this information has been integrated into the main cultural heritage report, the specific requirements of the OEH (2011) and DECCW (2010) guidelines are still relevant and should be demonstrated in the report prepared.

Given the above, the draft ACHA provided is viewed as incomplete and non-compliant with OEH guideline requirements. The limited content of the draft ACHA also means that Aboriginal registrants cannot comment on key aspects of the assessment, such as the methods and outcomes of the archaeological survey. There is also significant concern that the ACHA was prepared without adequate consultation of the cultural values of the Project area, and the social significance assessment it contains is incorrect and does not reflect Aboriginal registrant input.

On this basis, it is requested that the draft ACHA be revised and completed in accordance with OEH requirements, and then re-issued to Aboriginal registrants for a second 28 day review period.



8. Project Description – Additional Information Needed

The draft ACHA provides an overview of the proposed Project, but it is noted that this description does not provide information on the size of the Project area (ha) and the size of the disturbance area within the Project area (ha). These two areas should also be clearly illustrated on ACHA mapping, and it is noted that Figure 2 does not currently provide this.

It is also noted that the draft ACHA does not include a copy of the Project Director General Requirements for the Part 4.1 approval application for the Project, which should be included in the revised ACHA for the reference of Aboriginal registrants.

Development Proposal and Future Detailed Design

Section 3 of the draft ACHA provides mapping of the proposed Project, but this is described as the 'indicative general arrangement' of the Project. In Section 12, there is also reference to the exact placement of roads and infrastructure such as pipelines being determined in a future detailed design process.

Given that approval is currently being sought for a specific Project design and development impact area, the ACHA should clearly identify that any infrastructure placed beyond the Project disturbance area of this assessment would require the approval of DP&I through a Project modification application; to provide Aboriginal registrants with certainty that future impacts not considered by this ACHA will be adequately assessed.

In addition, the ACHA should also identify additional or relocated infrastructure within the Project's disturbance footprint will be assessed and managed, as the impact of such additional or relocated infrastructure has not assessed and managed by the draft ACHA provided. This should include a trigger for inspections by a field team of Aboriginal registrants and archaeologists, and the active involvement of Aboriginal registrants in the assessment of impact and development of management strategies.

1. Aboriginal registrant consultation re: cultural values and significance

Section 4.2 lists Aboriginal registrant involvement in the ACHA process in three bullet points, but the revised ACHA should include additional detail on how Aboriginal registrants were involved (meeting dates, Project matters discussed etc.), what input was provided, and importantly, how this influenced the assessment approach and outcomes. This should reflect OEH requirements, which states that one of the intended outcomes of consultation is that Aboriginal registrants: "influencing the design of the method to assess cultural and scientific significance of Aboriginal object(s) and/or place(s)" (DECCW 2010).

Section 4.2 states that Aboriginal registrants participated in the social and cultural study for the Project ACHA, and Section 10 presents the outcome of this process, being an



assessment of the cultural significance of known archaeological sites to Aboriginal people.

OEH guidelines identify that the assessment of cultural values is a dedicated process separate to archaeological assessment, and that it can involve a range of approaches such as oral history recording, cultural mapping, detailed ethno historical research etc. As stated by DEC (2005):

The social and cultural information leading to the establishment of social and cultural values includes the spiritual, traditional, historical or contemporary associations and attachments which the place or area has for the present-day Aboriginal community. This information will be obtained primarily from the Aboriginal community based on a process of community consultation and will involve a range of methodologies, such as cultural mapping, oral histories, archival documentation, and specific information provided by the Aboriginal community for the purposes of the study.

As also stated by OEH (in NPWS 1997), Aboriginal involvement in the archaeological assessment is important, but:

"Such participation should not be construed as 'consultation'. It is not a substitute for an assessment of Aboriginal cultural interests or values in a particular area of land or particular sites, such assessments being separate from archaeological assessments"

The level of cultural assessment within the draft ACHA provided is limited, which reflects the lack of a cultural assessment process for the Project, which has to date focused on archaeological assessment.

Given that the ACHA states compliance with DEC (2005) and NPWS (1997) in Section 1, in addition to current OEH guidelines which also reflect this approach, the ACHA process should include additional engagement with Aboriginal registrants on the social significance values of the Project area, the outcomes of which should be included in the revised ACHA.

3. Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Context

Section 6.1 provides a discussion of the ethno-historic context of for the Project ACHA, which consists of one page of text spanning pre-contact Aboriginal society and land use, and some aspects of the contact experience. Some additional information on the ethno historic context is also presented in Section 9, which discusses the archaeological record of past Aboriginal subsistence and settlement patterns.

The level of ethno historic information presented in the draft ACHA is viewed as inadequate, as it does not reflect the range of past Aboriginal associations with the Project area – including the historical experiences of Aboriginal people in the region.



As stated by OEH (2011), one of the key aims of ACHA research is to gain an understanding of the history of the peoples who have lived on the land in question; through developing a historic narrative of the past, and by identifying and mapping important places in the landscape used in the past. OEH (2011) also identify the importance of the historical experiences of Aboriginal people in the region, and the importance of involving Aboriginal people in identifying historic values and obtaining oral histories, given that documented histories often contain little information on the Aboriginal experience since contact.

Given the ACHA states compliance with OEH (2011) in Section 1, Section 6.2 of the ACHA should be revised to provide a more complete discussion of past Aboriginal associations, considering both pre- and post-contact land use and experiences. As OEH (2011) also identify that Aboriginal experiences are often poorly reflected in the written record, Aboriginal registrant input on the history of the area should also be integrated throughout the section to provide a more complete understanding of the history of the place.

Predictive Model Limitations

Section 7.1 presents a predictive model for Aboriginal archaeological sites within the Project area, in accordance with DECCW (2010) and OEH (2011) requirements.

This predictive model is currently limited as it does not characterize the likely patterning of archaeological sites based on known social and behavior of past Aboriginal use of the area, or make inferences about past Aboriginal occupation of the landscape; both of which are specifically required by the DECCW (2010) Code of Practice. As this would have been conducted prior to the archaeological survey in accordance with DECCW (2010), this should be reflected in the revised ACHA report.

5.

Field Survey Coverage and Effectiveness

Sections 7 and 8 do not provide a clear statement of how much of the Project area was inspected, and does not provide a map showing which parts of the Project area were inspected. Section 7.4.2 does however state that survey coverage can be 'deduced from the figures in Appendix 5', but the draft provided does not include any survey coverage in Appendix 5.

The OEH Code of Practice for archaeological investigation in NSW requires that archaeological reports provide detailed information on the aims, methods, effectiveness, and outcomes of archaeological survey; which the draft ACHA does not currently provide.

Given the total absence of information about the coverage and effectiveness of the archaeological survey of the Project area in the draft ACHA, no comment can currently be made on its adequacy. This information should be included in the revised draft ACHA and provided to Aboriginal registrants for review and comment.



5. Rationale for sampling approach to survey

Although the draft ACHA provided does not contain any information on survey coverage, it is understood that that the survey sampled the Project area rather than inspecting it in full.

Requirement 5 of the OEH Code of Practice sets out the requirements for sample archaeological surveys, which include sampling each landform within the impact area, place a emphasis of those landforms with high archaeological potential, describe how sampling relates to the impact area. Archaeologists also need to 'clearly state when a full coverage survey will be undertaken and justify when it is not'.

Given the draft ACHA provided does not contain this information, it should be included in the revised draft ACHA.

6. Level of information on known archaeological sites

Section 8 lists all sites recorded during survey, and provides a brief description of each. For most sites, this is a one line description of the location (ie, 2.5km from a particular road) and the number of artefacts recorded.

The level of information on known archaeological sites is not adequate, as Aboriginal registrants are not able to provide advice on the cultural significance of recorded sites on the basis of information contained in the draft ACHA report. This is a particular issue given the roster system for fieldwork, when not all registrants where involved, and those that were involved have not had the opportunity to visit each site.

The revised ACHA should include detailed information on each known site of the Project area, including mapping and photographs, for the reference of Aboriginal registrants.

5 Survey effectiveness

Section 8.4 is titled 'Effectiveness of the Survey', but this section does not discuss the effectiveness of the survey (ie survey coverage analysis as required by the OEH Code of Practice). This section instead includes a discussion of the archaeological potential of the Project area.

This section should include a discussion of the effectiveness of the survey in accordance with DECCW (2010) requirements; and a separate section should assess the archaeological potential of the Project area.



Assessment of archaeological potential

Section 8.4 introduces a discussion of the archaeological potential of the Project area, which identifies the likely site types that may occur and those which would not be expected to occur. This section also characterizes the archaeology of the Project area as composed of small, low density surface artefact scatters exposed by erosion and landscape disturbance, with a focus along the waterways of the locality. The occurrence of a single grinding groove site is also noted. However, Section 8.4 does not currently provide an assessment of the archaeological potential of the landforms within the Project area, which should include:

- The likely presence for additional, as yet unrecorded sites in Project areas not surveyed
- > The likely presence for subsurface deposits to occur at known archaeological site locations
- The likely presence of subsurface deposits to occur throughout the landforms of the Project area. Although the draft ACHA notes that the Project area does not contain lunettes or sand dunes, Section 5 states that it does contain alluvial plains extending from the Namoi River, alluvial foot slopes with weathered colluvium and a number of tributaries of the Namoi River catchment. These are landforms that would be expected to contain buried archaeological deposit, but this is not acknowledged in the draft ACHA provided. Other archaeological investigations in the region have also identified the potential for other hill slope and ridge landforms to contain archaeological deposits, although at lower site and artefact densities.
- Five of that the Project area contains landforms that may contain buried archaeological deposit, such as Namoi River floodplain, foot slopes with colluvium and a number of creek lines, a geomorphological assessment is requested as part of the revised ACHA, to ensure that heritage consultants and Aboriginal registrants adequately understand the potential for buried archaeological deposits, and the likely integrity of those buried deposits.

The absence of the above discussion is viewed as a significant limitation to the draft ACHA provided, and the above should be included in the revised ACHA for Aboriginal registrant review.

Discussion - meaning of the archaeological record

Section 9 provides a discussion of the Aboriginal cultural landscape of the Project area, informed by assessment results. However, as previously noted, the draft ACHA provided includes limited ethno historic research, provides no detailed on archaeological survey coverage and effectiveness, does not provide detailed information on known archaeological sites, and does not assess the archaeological potential of specific landforms within the Project area. These limitations are reflected throughout Section 9, which should be revised to include additional information.



It is also noted that although Section 9 does provide a summary of known site types and makes broad statements about dominant raw materials and site locations, it does not provide an adequate discussion of the <u>meaning</u> of the archaeology of the Project area, being what known sites tell us about how Aboriginal people used the landscape (i.e., specific activities in specific places) and what this meant in a local and regional context. This is expected in the revised ACHA report given current OEH guidelines, which require:

"...results must be interpreted using an archaeological framework that constructs an Aboriginal settlement history of the subject area" (DECCW 2010 – Code of Practice)

And

"Based on the information collected, provide a description and insight into what events took place in the past, how the landscape was used and why the identified Aboriginal objects are in this location". (OEH 2011 – ACHA guidelines)

Cultural Significance Assessment Approach

Section 1 of the report states that the ACHA was prepared in compliance with the Burra Charter (ICOMOS 1999) and OEH (2011) ACHA guidelines. These guidelines identify that cultural significance assessment should consider the 'social, historical, scientific and aesthetic significance' of cultural heritage places and objects.

Section 10.1 provides an introductory discussion of cultural significance, and refers to all four components; but the sections that follow only assess social, scientific and aesthetic significance. The revised ACHA should also include an assessment of historical significance in accordance with OEH guidelines and the Burra Charter.

3 Cultural Significance Assessment – Social (Approach)

OEH guidelines identify that "Social or cultural value can only be identified through consultation with Aboriginal people" as it "refers to the spiritual, traditional, historical or contemporary associations and attachments the place or area has for Aboriginal people. Social or cultural value is how people express their connection with a place and the meaning that place has for them" (OEH 2011).

As previously noted, OEH guidelines identify that assessing social value requires a dedicated process of community engagement, such as reflected in the below:

"social and cultural information....will be obtained primarily from the Aboriginal community based on a process of community consultation and will involve a range of methodologies, such as cultural mapping, oral histories, archival documentation, and specific information provided by the Aboriginal community for the purposes of the study". (DEC 2005)

"Participation (in archaeological assessments) should not be construed as 'consultation'. It is not a substitute for an assessment of Aboriginal cultural



interests or values in a particular area of land or particular sites, such assessments being separate from archaeological assessments"

Text throughout Section 10 should reflect the role of Aboriginal people in determining social significance, for example, the current statement that "the social value of a place is often difficult for heritage professionals to substantiate" should be removed as it is incorrect, as it is the role of heritage consultants to document social significance of Aboriginal cultural heritage to Aboriginal people – not to substantiate or interpret it.

Section 10 should also be amended to describe what process was undertaken to provide opportunity for social significance to be discussed and documented (noting the earlier request for additional engagement with Aboriginal registrants to document social significance).

It is also noted that in Section 10, it is stated that 'the views of the Aboriginal registrants involved in the field survey and community field inspections and discussion forums are considered to be indicative of Aboriginal community attitudes'.

This approach does not reflect professional guidelines, with OEH (2011) stating:

"There is not always consensus about a place's social or cultural value. Because people experience places and events differently, expressions of social or cultural value do vary and in some instances will be in direct conflict. When identifying values, it is not necessary to agree with or acknowledge the validity of each other's values but it is necessary to document the range of values identified. Social or cultural value can only be identified through consultation with Aboriginal people".

- In this context, the draft ACHA should document the range of views on the social significance of places and objects within the Project area but it should not assume that comments made during survey by individual people are representative of all Aboriginal registrants. Prior comments about the lack of a consultative process to discuss cultural values with Aboriginal people which is separate to the archaeological assessment should occur, as required by OEH guidelines. Only then can the ACHA be revised to include adequate information on social significance.
- 4. Cultural Significance Assessment Social (Outcomes)

In Section 10, it is also noted that Table 12 lists the social significance of all recorded sites as being of low social significance, with the exception of the grinding groove site as of moderate social significance.

Cultural Significance Assessment - Aesthetic

The Burra Charter identifies that aesthetic significance refers to..."aspects of sensory perception for which criteria can and should be stated. Such criteria may include



consideration of the form, scale, color, texture and material of the fabric; the smells and sounds associated with the place and its use".

Section 10.4 presents a short discussion of aesthetic significance stating that stone artefact scatters lack high aesthetic value, as does the grinding groove site as it is often submerged; but sites along the Namoi River have some aesthetic significance given their setting.

- 4. The draft ACHA does not identify how aesthetic significance has been assessed, and it also does not include Aboriginal registrant views on aesthetic significance which is vital given that it relates to aspects of sensory perception to people, and given that Aboriginal people are the primary determinants of the significance of Aboriginal cultural heritage. This information should be included in the revised ACHA, which may require further discussion with Aboriginal registrants on aesthetic significance.
- 4. Cultural Significance Assessment Summary

 Section 10.5 is titled 'Summary of Archaeological Significance' th

Section 10.5 is titled 'Summary of Archaeological Significance' – this should be retitled and content adjusted to provide a summary of all four significance values, which should be presented equally, reflecting OEH guidelines which state:

"Given that Aboriginal cultural heritage has social/cultural, historic, aesthetic and scientific (archaeological) significance; all aspects should be given the same weight and assessed equally by the proponent in the Aboriginal cultural heritage assessment report".

This section should also be broadened to include a discussion of any additional places or objects in the Project area of social or aesthetic value to Aboriginal people, as the current approach refers only to known archaeological sites, which may require further discussion with Aboriginal registrants on cultural significance. Given the limitations of consultation to date, this would require ongoing consultation with Aboriginal registrants on cultural values.

7. Aboriginal Registrant Involvement in Impact Assessment and Management

Section 4.1 states that Section 4 of the draft ACHA demonstrates how Aboriginal registrant input has been considered in determining and assessing impacts, developing management options and in making final recommendations; however, this section does not provide details of how this occurred, and this Section refers only to the formal registration process, the initial Project inception meeting, the development of a Project methodology and Aboriginal registrant involvement in fieldwork.

Although the draft ACHA has been provided to Aboriginal registrants for review and comment, to date there has been one meeting and no real active involvement of Aboriginal registrants assessing Project impacts, developing management options and in making final management recommendations; as is required by current OEH guidelines,



with DECCW (2010) stating that one of the key aims of consultation is to provide Aboriginal people:

"....with the opportunity to participate in decision making regarding the management of their cultural heritage by providing proponents information regarding cultural significance and inputting into management options".

OEH (in DEC 2005) also state:

"The close and on-going involvement and participation of Aboriginal people will be needed during the collection of the information and the development of management outcomes".

7. This lack of Aboriginal input into management options and into the decision making process represents a significant limitation and flaw in the Project's cultural heritage process, and it is requested that Whitehaven Coal actively engage with Aboriginal registrants to discuss these matters.

Impact Assessment - Grinding Groove Site

Section 11.3 states that the grinding grooves at 20-4-0009 will not be directly impacted by the Project, although Table 13 states that the site will be partially directly impacted.

The ACHA should be revised to specifically identify which part of the site will be directly impacted through mining, and what safeguards are in place to prevent indirect impacts to the rest of the site (including the grinding grooves).

It is also noted that Section 11.3 states that Wilkinson Murray has undertaken an assessment of potential impacts from blasting (vibration) to the grinding grooves and has concluded that 'blasting impacts would be negligible'; although no detailed information on the Wilkinson Murray assessment process or outcome is included within the draft ACHA.

Detailed information on the Wilkinson Murray assessment should be included in the revised ACHA for the reference of Aboriginal registrants, who should be informed on and involved in discussion on all aspects of cultural heritage assessment.

Management Framework

Section 1 states that the ACHA was prepared in accordance with guidelines such as the Burra Charter and the OEH ACHA guidelines; but key principles of managing cultural heritage outlined in these guidelines are not reflected in the draft ACHA provided. These include:

Consideration of the principles of ecologically sustainable development (ESD), in particular the precautionary principle and the principle of inter-generational equity (OEH 2011). These are not currently reflected in the impact assessment or management framework of the draft ACHA

- An understanding of the cumulative impact of the proposal in relation to other identified sites in the region. This is required by OEH (2011) but currently not included in the draft ACHA.
- 14. Identifying how, wherever practicable, harm to significant Aboriginal objects or places can be avoided, through redesigning the proposed to avoid the expected harm. This is required by OEH (2011) but currently not reflected in the text of the draft ACHA.
- 7. Establishing and assessing the consequences of various management options, which should be developed in consultation with Aboriginal registrants. This is required by OEH (2011) but the draft ACHA presents only one set of management options, being those recommended by the heritage consultant.
- Identifying management outcomes that are appropriate given the cultural significance of the places and objects impacted. Given the limitations of the ACHA process and report in assessing cultural values (including historical and aesthetic values), and in identifying areas of archaeological potential, the management strategies presented are also limited.

7. Management of known archaeological sites within Project disturbance area

Section 12.2 identifies management strategies for the 24 sites to be fully impacted by the Project, if approved, and the additional 8 sites to be partially impacted. This includes the baseline recording of sites prior to disturbance 'and artefacts salvaged for safekeeping'.

Section 12.2 does not specifically identify what archaeological salvage works will be conducted for all impacted sites, although collection of surface artefacts only is later implied in the text.

The revised ACHA should clearly identify the level of archaeological salvage considered appropriate for each site based on their social, historical, scientific and aesthetic significance. Given that the understanding of cultural significance of known sites may be amended through further Aboriginal registrant consultation and assessment, this may also result in amended management strategies. This is a fundamental principle of cultural heritage management, as stated by the Burra Charter (see below extract) and in current OEH guidelines:

Management of cultural heritage places and objects must be based on an understanding of cultural significance, as relative degrees of cultural significance may lead to different conservation or impact mitigation management actions.



7. Salvage methodology

Section 12.2 identifies that archaeological salvage activities would occur for 32 known Aboriginal sites should the Project be approved, but there is no reference to a methodology for the proposed salvage works.

The revised draft ACHA should identify that this would be developed as part of the ACHMP, and that Aboriginal registrants would have an active role in developing the draft methodology, which may identify different salvage actions based on the varying cultural significance of known sites.

7 Management of salvaged cultural objects

Section 12.2 states that Aboriginal registrants will provide advice on the later management of salvaged objects at the completion of Project activities, and refers to the placement of artefacts onto the post mining landscape as an example. The summary presented in Section 12.4 also states that collected artefacts will be stored in a Keeping Place at the Red Chief Local Aboriginal Land Council, before being later placed within rehabilitated areas of the mine in consultation with Aboriginal registrants and OEH. Further Aboriginal registrant discussion is needed on the management of salvaged objects, including both interim and final arrangements; and it is not appropriate for the ACHA to present outcomes until Aboriginal registrants have advised on culturally appropriate outcomes. Whitehaven Coal should seek advice on this issue from Aboriginal registrants and include the outcome in the revised ACHA or Project ACHMP, as interim management strategies need to be in place before the commencement of archaeological salvage works.

7. Management of known archaeological sites not impacted by the Project

Section 12 does not identify management protocols for the management of known archaeological sites that are not impacted by the Project, currently being eight known sites.

Protective management protocols should be included in the revised ACHA, and could include: installation of protective fencing (which may need to be stock proof where cattle remain in the vicinity of the site), fenced sites forming exclusion zone for Whitehaven personnel and contractors, where access requires permission from the relevant Whitehaven Coal contact, installation of fencing to provide details of the relevant Whitehaven Coal, and the ongoing inspection of protected sites by a field team of Aboriginal registrant representatives and archaeologists. The latter would have to occur on a regular basis, for example, every six months, to monitor the condition of all protected sites. As with all other components of Aboriginal cultural heritage assessment and management works, Aboriginal registrants should be directly involved in the installation of protective fencing (to determine appropriate boundaries) and the ongoing inspection program.



7. Staging of archaeological salvage works

Section 12 does not identify the timing of archaeological salvage works over the life of the Project, which should be included in the revised draft ACHA.

Should some archaeological sites not be impacted in the earliest stage of construction and mining, they should be protected until the time of their future salvage, through protective fencing, signage, and an ongoing site inspection program.

7. Protocols for management of new finds

Section 12 presents a management protocol for the discovery of Aboriginal remains or burials, but the draft ACHA provided does not provide a management protocol for the management of other new finds such as stone artefact scatters and other archaeological site types. New finds are commonly found following the original survey, and given it was a sample survey and landforms of archaeological potential occur within the Project area, it is likely that new finds will be found throughout the life of the Vickery Coal Mine project.

The revised ACHA should include a management protocol for new finds, developed in consultation with Aboriginal registrants. As with all other Aboriginal cultural heritage assessment and management components, the protocol should reflect the active role of Aboriginal registrants in assessing significance and impact and determining appropriate management.

Heritage Management Plan

Section 12 refers to the preparation a Heritage Management Plan for all Aboriginal cultural heritage management activities for the Project.

This should be a specific 'Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Management Plan' for the Project, and the content should be developed in collaboration with Aboriginal representatives. This should include continued discussion of management strategies to resolve outstanding details such as the management of salvaged objects and appropriate level of salvage works based on cultural significance.

Section 12 should also be amended to include information on the ongoing review and revision of the Project ACHMP throughout the life of the Project. Given that cultural heritage management obligations will change throughout the life of the Project, it is standard practice to review the ACHMP on a regular basis to ensure its adequacy and effectiveness. This should be included in the revised ACHA, with a commitment for the active involvement of Aboriginal registrants in the review process.



7. Erosion and sediment control works

Section 12.3.1 states that erosion and sediment control works will be undertaken in accordance with the requirements of the Project approval and in consideration of other Aboriginal cultural heritage management measures.

Erosion and sediment control works, and a range of other environmental land management works, may have the potential to impact Aboriginal archaeological sites and features, including buried deposits of stone artefacts. The revised ACHA should acknowledge this, and identify that management protocols will be developed in conjunction with Aboriginal registrants, with the outcome included in the Project ACHMP.

Role of the local Aboriginal community

Section 12.3 states that there will be ongoing consultation with the local Aboriginal community over the life of the Project, and specifically refers to continued Aboriginal involvement in archaeological salvage activities.

As the ACHA previously identified compliance with guidelines such as the Burra Charter, Ask First and current OEH guidelines, this section should be revised to include both a framework for ongoing Aboriginal involvement and specific commitments for ongoing consultation that reflect the key principles of these documents. This should include statements such as the following:

In recognising the rights and interests of Indigenous peoples in their heritage, all parties concerned with identifying, conserving and managing this heritage should acknowledge, accept and act on the principles that Indigenous people:

- are the primary source of information on the value of their heritage and how this is best conserved;
- must have an active role in any Indigenous heritage planning process;
- must have input into primary decision-making in relation to Indigenous heritage so they can continue to fulfil their obligations towards this heritage; and
- Must control intellectual property and other information relating specifically to their heritage, as this may be an integral aspect of its heritage value.
- The ACHA should also refer to specific consultation commitments and cultural protocols – or identify that these will be developed as part of ACHMP preparation. Examples of protocols that should be discussed with Aboriginal registrants include:



- Regular Project meetings to discuss cultural heritage management with Aboriginal registrants, for example, every six months during early stages of Project
- Written updates to Aboriginal registrants on progress of cultural heritage management works

It is noted that these could be subject to further discussion with Aboriginal registrants, with outcomes included in the ACHMP.

Cultural Awareness Training

Section 12.3.4 states that the effective application of the ACHMP is dependent on an appreciation of its content and function by on-site staff and employees; and therefore recommends training for 'all on-site personnel' regarding the ACHMP strategies relevant to their employment tasks.

Any form of Aboriginal cultural awareness training should involve Aboriginal representation, and this should be subject to further discussion during preparation of the Project's ACHMP. Examples of an appropriate approach would be to:

- > Ensure that personnel have an understanding of the importance of Aboriginal cultural heritage, and the depth of history of the Project area in which they work
- Ensure that management personnel have an understanding of all aspects of the Project ACHMP, and the role of Aboriginal people and heritage consultants in the ongoing management of cultural heritage throughout the life of the Project
- Ensure that on-site personnel have an understanding of the range of archaeological sites that might occur within the Project area
- > Ensure that on-site personnel are aware of the procedures to apply

7. Aboriginal involvement in artefact management

Section 12.4 states that Whitehaven Coal should involve Aboriginal registrants and community in artefact recording, curation, storage and replacement.

This should be further discussed during ACHMP preparation, to ensure that Whitehaven Coal provides opportunity for ongoing Aboriginal involvement in the management of salvaged objects, and that this is reflected through the inclusion of specific commitments in the Project ACHMP.

Blast vibration monitoring

Section 11.3 of the draft ACHA states that the impact of blasting vibration on the grinding grooves at AHIMS site 20-4-0009 would be 'negligible', as assessed by Wilkinson Murray. Further information on this issue has been requested in the revised ACHA as none is provided within the draft ACHA. It is also noted that monitoring of blast vibration at the grinding groove site should be discussed with Aboriginal registrants, as it is a common management strategy for where blasting vibration of any



level may affect a significant sandstone site like a grinding groove. The outcome of this discussion should be reflected in the Project ACHMP.

Terminology

The document refers throughout to 'consultation with the local Aboriginal community'. This should be amended to 'registered Aboriginal parties' throughout, as broader Aboriginal community consultation has not been undertaken — consultation has only been undertaken with those individuals and organisations who formally registered an interest in the Project in accordance with the DECCW (2010) consultation process.

I am writing this letter for myself and others listed in the attached.

Thankyou for your report regarding the Vickery Coal Draft Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment Project, we have read the report and strongly reject it as we believe that the report does not meet the 2010 Guidelines or the Burra Charter in terms of requirements and adequacy.

ACHA prepared by Matt Cupper of Landskape Natural Cultural Heritage Management, following prior survey and assessment by Kayandel Archaeology. The ACHA states that it is prepared in accordance with the following:

- DECCW (2010) consultation requirements
- > DECCW (2010) Code of Practice
- > OEH (2011) ACHA guidelines
- > DEC (2005) Part 3A guidelines
- > Australia ICOMOS (1999) Burra Charter
- > NPWS (1997) Standards and Guldelines Kit
- > AHC (2002) Ask First
- > NSW Minerals Council (2010) Due Diligence Code of Practice

These requirements are indicative of State Significant Development assessments requirements but the report needs to reference or confirm the DGRs

However, there are several aspects of the ACHA process undertaken and draft report provided that <u>simply do not reflect the principles and specific requirements of the above quidelines</u>,

Key concerns relate to:



Basic information on the Project is not provided, such as the size (ha) of the Project area, the size (ha) of the disturbance area within the Project area, and mapping which clearly illustrates this (noting that Figure 2 of the draft ACHA does not clearly illustrate this)



Aboriginal involvement in all stages of the assessment and management process, with consultation specifically lacking in:



The lack of a consultative process to seek Aboriginal registrant views on the cultural values of the Project area



The approach that views of some Aboriginal registrants 'are considered to be indicative of Aboriginal community attitudes' (Section 10.2). OEH guidelines acknowledge the diversity of social values that may occur within the Aboriginal community, who may have a range of traditional, historic and contemporary attachments to an area. To assume a singular view of cultural significance amongst the Aboriginal registrants involved in the Project is not appropriate, and it does not reflect professional guidelines



The inclusion of an assessment of social significance of archaeological sites that does not reflect past Aboriginal registrant input on social significance



The lack of consultation to actively involve Aboriginal people in determining Project impacts to cultural heritage values



> The lack of consultation to actively involve Aboriginal people in developing management options and determining appropriate final management recommendations



~ The level of ethnohistoric research presented in the draft ACHA is limited, and it does not reflect the range of past Aboriginal associations with the Project area – including the historical experiences of Aboriginal people in the region.

- 3. > The predictive model developed for the Project does not integrate ethnohistoric information on past Aboriginal associations with the Project area, both pre- and post-contact
- > The level of information on the archaeological survey strategy is limited, and it does not provide a justification for sampling, or describe how sampling relates to the Project area/disturbance area, and how each landform proposed for impact will be sampled
- > No information is provided on the coverage of the archaeological survey, being the total area inspected (ha) and the placement of survey transects; which should be described in writing and illustrated on mapping.
- 5. No information is provided on the effectiveness of survey coverage, given ground surface visibility conditions at the time of survey
- 9. The draft ACHA does not provide an assessment of the archaeological potential of the landforms of the Project area, considering both the occurrence of surface sites and features beyond survey areas, and the distribution and integrity of subsurface archaeological deposits.
- 9. The draft ACHA also fails to discuss the archaeological potential of landforms normally identified as being of high archaeological potential, being creek lines, the floodplain of the Namoi River and footslopes with colluvium.
- The draft ACHA provides a limited discussion of the meaning of the archaeology of the Project area, which OEH describe as discussion of what events took place in the past, how the landscape was used and why the identified Aboriginal objects are in this location.
- 3. > The draft ACHA does not provide an assessment of the historic significance of the Project area and the specific places/objects contained within it
- The draft ACHA presents an assessment of the social significance of known archaeological sites, but does not discuss the social significance of the broader area and non-archaeological places to Aboriginal registrants reflecting a limited consultation process regarding cultural values.
- The draft ACHA presents an assessment of the social significance of known archaeological sites, which describes all sites except one as being of low significance (and describes the remaining site a grinding groove and scatter complex as being of moderate significance). This does not reflect Aboriginal registrant input on the significance of archaeological sites, and this section should be urgently amended to document Aboriginal registrant views, as OEH guidelines identify that it is only Aboriginal people that determine the social significance of Aboriginal cultural heritage.
- 7 The assessment of aesthetic significance makes no comment on the importance of sites and places to Aboriginal people.
- The assessment of Project impact is limited to archaeological sites only, and does not address the broader impact of the Project on the landforms of the Project area, including landforms of archaeological potential.
- The impact assessment includes a statement that the impact of blasting (vibration) to the grinding groove site will be negligible, although no information on how this was determined has been included or discussed with Aboriginal registrants
- 7. The management strategy for the Project Is limited in scope, on the basis that the Project area contains no archaeological sites of high social or scientific value, and that there are no other places or objects of cultural value. This is questioned and considered insufficient, as the ACHA does not adequately assess the cultural values and the archaeological potential of the Project area, and management strategies have not been developed in consultation with Aboriginal registrants. The following management strategies are identified as requiring discussion with Aboriginal registrants for inclusion in the revised ACHA:
 - Management protocols for continued Aboriginal registrant involvement and consultation
 - Management protocols for the management (protection) of known archaeological sites not impacted by the Project
 - Management protocols for the management of new finds (all archaeological objects as defined by the NPW Act)
 - Management protocols for due diligence inspections of additional or relocated Project infrastructure within the Project's disturbance footprint, if not specifically assessed by Protocols for archaeological excavation (test pitting and open area salvage) for sites/landforms of archaeological potential
 - ~ Management protocols for erosion and sediment control works in landforms of archaeological potential
 - ~ Management protocols for access to cultural sites and areas by Aboriginal community members
 - Management protocols for baselines recording of the grinding groove site and blast vibration monitoring if appropriate

- Management protocols for the temporary care of salvaged objects
- Management protocols for the ongoing review and revision of the Project ACHMP
- > Any additional management protocols identified by the completed cultural values assessment and assessment of archaeological potential.
- > The draft ACHA does not contain a technical archaeological appendix, which is the approach outlined by both the OEH Code of Practice for Archaeological Investigations (DECCW 2010) and the OEH (2011) ACHA guideline. Even if this information has been integrated into the main cultural heritage report, the specific requirements of the OEH (2011) and DECCW (2010) guidelines are still relevant and should be demonstrated in the report prepared.
- The report has also omitted to record Abortginal cultural features identified as important to the RAPs and their omission is highly concerning. The report does not describe how this conclusion was reached (apart from vaguely referring to fieldwork opportunities to comment on management), and it is inconsistent with views expressed by RAPs.

Given the above, the draft ACHA provided is viewed as incomplete and non-compliant with OEH guideline requirements. The limited content of the draft ACHA also means that Aboriginal registrants cannot comment on key aspects of the assessment, such as the methods and outcomes of the archaeological survey. There is also significant concern that the ACHA was prepared without adequate consultation of the cultural values of the Project area, and the social significance assessment it contains is incorrect and does not reflect Aboriginal registrant input.

- There has been only two meetings with the Registered Aboriginal Parties, therefore consultation has been seriously lacking. There has been no attempt to seek out our Elders /knowledge holders, this is evident in the stories in the report which does not reflect the stories passed on traditionally by our ancestors and was according to your Archaeologist researched from a book.
- We find this research disrespectful especially to our Elders listening and reading these reports as our oral history was not sought out and holds great significance to our history. There are big issues and concerns about the Archaeological assessment and understanding of the Aboriginal history of the project area. The flaws are reflected in the management framework which is based on the view that all sites are of lower scientific and social significance-and which falls to consider a range of known and likely cultural heritage management issues. It also fails to make any attempt to provide analysis about the social cultural significance of the area and the culture within the area.
- Given that an assessment report provides the basis for managing cultural heritage for the life of a project, we the undersigned formally request a complete revision of the draft and all concerns and inadequacles listed need to be fully addressed. A whole new ACHA needs to be carried out by a fully qualified Archaeologist and specialist consultants elected by the Aboriginal stakeholders and completed to the standard required by OEH and ACOMOS Burra Charter. It should then be re-issued to Aborlginal registrants for a second 28 day review.
 - The Aboriginal registrants and Elders believe there is insufficient information to even make comment on some parts of the assessment. There are also concerns regarding the archaeologist involved in the project Lance Symes and his qualifications as a fully qualified archaeologist therefore his ability to do the reports and any archaeology investigations would be a serious issue. Due to Lance Symes qualifications and the current archaeologist doing a desk top study for this project we find it inadequate, disrespectful and totally unprofessional by Whitehaven Coal to endorse this report.

As Aboriginal Registrants Traditional Owners and Elders of the community we are not against any development providing it is carried out professionally and with proper cultural and heritage assessments according to requirements and undertaken with respect and sensitivity to the views and concerns of all involved.


